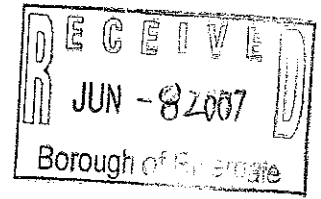

Dear Stormwater Program Coordinator:

The Department would also like to clarify a recent policy decision concerning your De-icing Storage structures. Due to a number of concerns raised at Highway Agency, Public Complex and Tier A workshops, from our case managers for the Municipal Stormwater Regulation Program and enforcement staff, the Department will not be requiring de-icing structures to be constructed with a door. However, the Department strongly recommends that a door is installed on the de-icing structure and may make it a mandatory permit requirement when the Highway Agency permit is renewed in 2009. Please note that if your Highway Agency is choosing to use a steel framed fabric structure, the structure must meet all of the criteria (including the requirement to have a door) in order to be considered a permanent structure and comply with permit conditions.
